Sample Criteria

Score	Criteria
-10 pts	Non Specific Animal Source ("Meat", "Poultry")
-3 pts	Protein Source is not Meat
+5 pts	Organic or Natural Ingredients
+5 pts	Endorsed by Nutritionist or Veterinarian



It is based on:





FULL AKC CRITERIA

NEGATIVE CRITERIA

- 10 points if the ingredients contain any "by-product"
- 10 points if the ingredients contain any non-specific animal source like "meat" or "poultry"
- 3 points if there are less than two meats in the first 3 ingredients
- 3 points if the protein sources are not meat
- 2 points if lamb is the only protein source
- 1 point if the food contains beef
- 2 points if the food contains animal fat other than fish oil
- 5 points if the ingredients contain "mill run" or non-specific grains
- 5 points if a grain ingredient is used twice in the first five ingredients
- 3 points if the ingredients include corn
- 2 points if corn is listed in the first five ingredients
- 2 points if the food contains wheat
- 2 points if soy or soybeans are an ingredient
- 10 points if there are chemicals preservatives like BHA, BHT, and ethoxyquin
- 3 points if there are any artificial colors
- 1 point if the food contains salt

POSITIVE CRITERIA

- 5 points if any of the meat is organic
- 2 points if any of the meat is hormone or antibiotic free
- 1 point for every animal protein source
- 3 points if ingredients include probiotics
- 3 points if the ingredients include fruit
- 3 points if the ingredients contains vegetables
- 1 point if the vegetables and fruits are pesticide-free
- 2 points if the ingredients include barley
- 2 points if the ingredients include flaxseed oil
- 1 point if the ingredients oats or oatmeal
- 1 point if the ingredients contain sunflower oil
- 1 point if the food is fortified with glucosamine and chondroitin
- 5 points if the food is baked or freeze dried
- 5 points if the food is endorsed by any veterinarian nutrition organization or veterinarian nutritionist



THE FULL WOOF EQUATION

WOOF SCORE = (AKC FOOD GRADE)*.93 + (AMAZON FACTOR)*.10

Such that:

- Woof Score [0,1]
- AKC Food Grade [0,100] if above 100, it will be rounded down to a perfect score
- Amazon Factor [0,7]
